



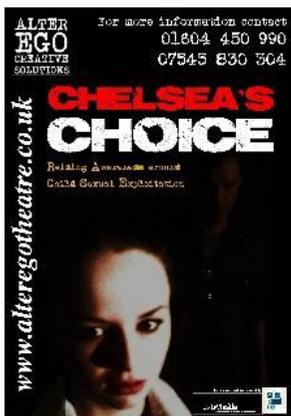

CHELSEA'S CHOICE

We are delighted to announce that Chelsea's Choice will be returning to Redcar & Cleveland Schools week commencing 18 April 2016. Along with delivering performances at all secondary schools we will be hosting two twilight sessions for parents, councillors, foster carers, school safeguarding leads **and various professionals who work with young people in Redcar and Cleveland**

'Chelsea's Choice' is a hard-hitting, 35 minute long Applied Theatre Production that has proven highly successful in raising awareness amongst young people of the issues surrounding Child Sexual Exploitation. The play is followed by a 25 minute plenary session exploring the issues raised in the play.

Recently, a new advert on teenage relationship abuse was shown on TV for the first time during the Brits.

The advert is part of an innovative campaign called 'Disrespect NoBody' which is jointly funded by the Government Equalities Office (GEO) and the Home Office.

The TV advert, along with a dedicated website, marks the start of a six week campaign encouraging young people to re-think their views about abuse and consent in relationships.

A mixture of radio, TV on demand and teen websites such as Xbox, Skype and Heatworld will also be used to get messages across to girls and boys between the ages of 12 to 18 years of age.

It builds on the Home Office 'This is Abuse' campaign which has been running since 2010. This is the first year that GEO has jointly funded the campaign which is focused on tackling violence against women and girls (VAWG). Its purpose is to challenge the attitudes of teenage boys and girls as early possible to stop abusive behaviours being seen as the norm.

The new creative concept was developed, informed and tested on young people. It uses puppet body parts to tackle sensitive issues such as controlling and coercive behaviours, sexting, pornography, violence, rape and consent.
