



Coatham Conservation Area Management Plan

Strategic Environmental Assessment Screening Statement

This statement sets out Redcar & Cleveland Borough Council's determination of the need for a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) in accordance with Regulation 9(3) of the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004 and European Directive 2001/42/EC for the Coatham Conservation Area Management Plan.

1. Introduction

- 1.1. The Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004 require that plans setting the framework for consent on future development projects are subject to an environmental assessment. The object of the Strategic Environment Assessment (SEA) is to provide for a high level of environmental protection and the integration of environmental considerations into the preparation and adoption of plans and programmes.
- 1.2. Regulation 5(6) provides an exemption to this requirement by stating that an environmental assessment need not be carried out for a plan or programme which determines the use of a small area at local level or for a minor modification to a plan or programme, unless it has been determined that the plan, programme or modification is likely to have significant environmental effects. This screening statement has been prepared, therefore, to determine whether the proposed Coatham CAMP is likely to have significant environmental effects and should be subject to an SEA under the 2004 Regulations.

2. The Coatham CAMP

- 2.1. The Coatham Conservation Area provides protection to parts of the historic environment of Coatham that are of special architectural or historic interest. To ensure conservation areas are preserved and enhanced, local planning authorities are required to formulate plans for their conservation. The Coatham CAMP meets this requirement and will illustrate the positives and negatives of the Coatham Conservation Area and provide a series of actions

for the Council that will be instrumental in ensuring preservation and encouraging enhancement of the area

- 2.2. The Coatham CAMP will also include guidance for residents on what type of changes are likely to be sympathetic, encouraging residents to also consider the preservation of the conservation area and will provide guidance for the implementation of Local Plan Policy HE1.

3. Conclusion

- 3.1. The results of the screening process for the proposed Coatham CAMP are set out in Appendix 1 of this statement. These results confirm that the CAMP is unlikely to result in significant environmental effects and the Council, therefore, considers that it will not be necessary to carry out an SEA on the draft Coatham CAMP.

The CAMP provides guidance on the implementation of policies relating to the conservation of the historic environment and a series of measures that will protect the conservation area.
